Village Survey

Many thanks to all those who returned their questionnaire – returns were in excess of 30%, an improvement on the 2005 survey. All the ticks and comments are now being analysed and we will let you know the findings shortly. The results of the survey will then be the main theme for the *Annual Village Meeting* in the evening of 19 May in the Village Hall. More details on that nearer the time (but do reserve the date).

Village Action Plan

The Parish Council maintains a Village Action Plan (VAP) which is a form of Business Plan covering the next year or two. Some of the major items included in the VAP are Refurbishment of the Pavilion, Road Safety at Friston Church, Public Toilets adjacent to the Village Hall, updating the Village Design Statement, Leasing the Farrer Hall from the National Trust, and Closing the Old Village Hall Trust. Progress against the VAP is reported in Council and Committee minutes, and a summary list of the *live issues*, together with their current status, is posted on Council Noticeboards and in the on-line library. Do take a look.

War Memorial

This monument has been standing for nearly 100 years. It has stood up to the



elements well but not surprisingly there are signs of fatigue, although the base and foundations seem solid. A structural and a stonemason's survey have recently been undertaken, and once we have studied the report we will aim to undertake any essential repairs in the Spring 2014. Pending the results and formal quotations for repair, a

pre-application for a grant towards repairing the Memorial has been made to the War Memorial Trust - 2014 will mark 100 years since the start of the First World War. The War Memorial is recorded within *War Memorials On-line*.

Village Fete

As you may be aware the Royal British Legion has decided not to arrange the Village Fete in the future. We have considered stepping into the breach but have decided not to do anything for 2014 but to consider organising a new style Fete for 2015, possibly on the Recreation Ground or elsewhere. Other organisations may do something in 2014.



Meet a Councillor

Here we meet Jen Sargent who grew up in Reigate marrying, at the age of 20, Roger a journalist. They moved to

Uganda, where Roger worked as a Foreign and War Correspondent (a 'stringer' for Fleet Street) living in Uganda, firstly with



Milton Obote in power then following the 1971 military coup, under Idi Amin's terrifying regime. They moved to Zimbabwe (Rhodesia) a country with an ominous feeling of unrest and no British Embassy to flee to as, under Ian Smith, Rhodesia had no political relationship with the UK. Jen had three children all born in different countries. Further periods were spent living in Beirut, Johannesburg and Dubai. Roger aged only 50 died suddenly. From 1987, Jen worked for 25 years in Local Government as Housing Manager for a Surrey District Council, moving with Rob, her partner of many years - who sadly died last August - to East Dean in 2009. Jen has a daughter in Surrey and sons in Tokyo and Oregon, three small grandchildren and a teenage step-grandson in North Wales. Jen has a Science Degree graduating at age 65; is a Community First Responder and has been a Parish Councillor since 2011.

Parish Council Elections

Parish Councils are the first tier of local government and we are one of about 8,500 of them in England and 82 in East Sussex. We have limited variable tax raising powers and the component part of the Council Tax which comes to us from Wealden District Council is known as the Precept. It amounts to some £40,000pa. Councillors are elected for a period of four years and the next Parish Council elections will take place in May 2015. It may sound a long way off, but time passes quickly. Would you like to help in the community? Might you be interested in standing as a Councillor? Would you like to find out more about what we do? You may wish to consider these questions. Strengthening Local Relationships

Twice a year representatives of the Parish Council meet with ESCC officers to review items of common interest. This is under the banner of Strengthening Local Relationships (SLR) and the majority of items discussed relate to Highways. The last meeting was held in October and the items covered included: possibility of footpath connecting Old Willingdon Road to Windmill Lane; reclassifying Birling Gap Road as a 'B' road as it is a bus route; untaxed vehicles on unadopted roads; Airborne; derestriction signs on the Downlands Estate and the recording of actual speeds reached; fly tipping; additional yellow lines, and highway verge maintenance.

Bus Shelters

The Council own and maintain the bus shelters within the village. To help smarten and brighten them up they will be furnished with floral displays in the spring with the help of the Gardening Club.

Website

Visits to the website have increased significantly over the past couple of months. In addition to the normal growth, the new *Clubs & Societies* section has proved popular, and there was a spike of visitors accessing the Bonfire details in early November.
