Annual Meetings

There are two (totally different) annual meetings arranged by the Council each year. The first is the *Annual Village Meeting*; this is not a council meeting but a meeting for all residents of the village. This year it will take place at 6.30pm on 19 May in the Village Hall, and the theme is the *Village Survey*. Do come along. The other meeting is the *Annual Council Meeting* at which the Chairman is selected, councillors are allocated to committees and formal documents are confirmed. This meeting will be held at 6.30pm on 22 May; it's a relatively brief meeting and you are very welcome to attend.

Year-end Finances

For the year ended 31 March 2014 the council made a cash deficit of £13.5k. However, this included receipts from the OVHT and a greater payment to clear the remaining balance of the loan taken out to help with the construction of the present village hall. Excluding these transactions there was a cash surplus for the year of £9.1k. Year-end cash at bank (reserves) stood at £19.4k. This is being carried forward to help meet the budgeted deficit for 2014/15.



Mobile Library

ESCC will shortly be consulting on changes to the mobile library service within their area. The impact on East Dean would be to reduce the fortnightly schedule for the mobile library to three-weekly visits. The Parish Council will await the consultation material, but whatever happens consideration will be at Earror Hall in due course

given to providing a library facility at Farrer Hall in due course.

The Fridays

The grass area at The Fridays is owned and maintained by Wealden District Council. We asked WDC if they would consider transferring ownership to the Parish Council and we would then maintain it and cut the grass more regularly. WDC declined but said they would consider increasing the cutting frequency. We will be following this up with Wealden.

Did You Know?

The average East Sussex household creates nearly a tonne of waste and recycling each year which costs around £155 per household to manage. The ESCC strategy sets a 2020 recycling target of 50% for the county's households increasing to 60% by 2025. Through the Newhaven Energy Recovery Facility, 91% of waste that previously went to landfill is now incinerated providing enough power to supply 25,000 homes and saving council tax payers £1.6m pa.



Meet a Councillor

Dave Cooper joined the Parish Council in 2013 and is Chairman of the Village Hall Trust. Born in Eastbourne he attended Eastbourne Grammar School

followed by a 4 year apprenticeship with British Rail. Dave is a Chartered Engineer and holds a BSc and two Masters Degrees.



He is a past President of Eastbourne Chamber of Commerce and more recently the organiser of the Eastbourne Carnival, for the third time. He is a member of the Eastbourne Commission, a think tank set up by Eastbourne MP, Stephen Lloyd. Dave received the Freedom of the City of London in 2002 and is a Liveryman in the Worshipful Company of Engineers. He also holds the post of Honorary Visiting Researcher at the University of Northampton. His most recent award-winning project was as Chief Technical Advisor to the Government, for the Emirates Cable Car over the Thames for the London Olympics. Dave lives with his partner, Lyn, and they have three children.

Village Action Plan

The Parish Council is pleased to support the continuation of the service provided by Cuckmere Bus and has agreed some slight changes to the timetable so that the services on both days are now the same.
